1 Peter 3:9-10

* Although the tongue weighs very little

very few people are able to hold it.		
* The Bible's clear that we need to have an appropriate for the words we speak.		
James 1:26 - Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless.		
* The of your conversation is crucial.		
Proverbs 12:18 - The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.		
* Speaking about important issues, situations, or incidents with people who are part of the problem , part of the solution , or someone who can provide wise , godly counsel is gossip.		
Ecclesiastes 3:7b – (There is) a time to be silent and a time to speak.		
Our working definition of gossip: Sharing inappropriate information about someone who isn't present with another person that could lead to a moral judgment and usually contains a certain entertainment value.		
* Gossip often includes some mixed with some of our own personal interpretation & judgement.		
* Gossip tends to be, hidden, secret, stealthy, sly.		
* News is information that's everybody's business. Gossip is information that's really nobody's business.		

1 Peter 3:9-10 - Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep their tongue from evil and their lips from deceitful speech."
